



Gulf of México Ocean Sport Fishing

- 1 Day Trip from the city of Veracruz –



The Gulf of México waters off the coast of Veracruz offers some excellent sport fishing. Depending on the season, you may catch marlin, tarpon, dorado, sailfish, amberjack, kingfish, and more. Our trips are *catch & release* only. Don't worry, you can still get your "trophy photo" with your big catch on board before you let it go. Your professional English/Spanish speaking ocean fishing guide is also the Veracruz state representative for the *International Gaming Fish Association*. He has had years of experience in catching, tagging, and releasing fish up and down the coast of Mexico as well as in the waters off the east coast of the United States.

The Itinerary

In the early morning, secure a taxi from where you are staying to take you to the *Veracruz Yacht Club* to meet your fishing guide. After some brief instructions, you will motor out to sea on a custom 24 foot fishing boat with your party of up to 4 people, the captain/fishing guide, and a deckhand. You can bring on board your own food/snacks and drinks of your choice.

The best months for Tarpon are mid-April thru mid-June. The summer months are good for catching Marlin, Sailfish, Dorado, Dolphin, and Maco Sharks. Any time of the year is good to catch bottom feeders such as Red Snapper and Mud Snapper.

Your trip includes all fishing gear, bait, and a cooler with ice to store your drinks and food.
